Messy Church was the idea of a lady in Portsmouth in 2004, who felt that her church was not being successful in reaching out to their community. It was designed for children as a 2 hour session, where they could be involved in a variety of 'messy' craft activities, hence the name! Children could only attend if they were accompanied by an adult, who was encouraged to take part. There was a 10-15 minute time for worship in church, with singing and story telling, followed by a meal. This was in response to the fact that many families don't often share a meal at the table together and have a chance to talk to each other.

Messy Church has been embraced by many churches in the UK and across the world. Most hold it once a month, often on a Sunday afternoon, but this is open to discussion. If we are to set up our own *Messy Church* project we would need quite a lot of help in all 3 areas of the session: craft activities, worship and food preparation.
